

Companion Animal House and Veterinary Services Centre

- The Companion Animal House includes a variety of animals such as chinchillas, degus, snakes, lizards, guinea pigs and rabbits
- The Veterinary Services Centre is used for teaching and research, and also home to veterinary physiotherapy clinics. It is home to offices, eight consulting rooms, a store, and hydrotherapy suite

Zoology




Zoology is the study of the animal kingdom and how they interact with their ecosystems, and exciting careers opportunities are plentiful.
