
Searching your Library Print and Electronic Resources

Whether you want to find a book, an electronic journal article or other electronic information start your search in the same place, the simple search box, called **Find it @ Harper** in the green band on our library home page (http://www.harper-adams.ac.uk/university-life/library/ (and every other page of the Library pages on the website):

Start your Search




Type in a small number of key words to find information on a topic or perhaps one or two words from the title and the author's surname if you are looking for a specific book

For books you will need to use more general keywords than for journal articles. For these you may need to be very specific.


Please note that **Find it @ Harper** cannot search Estates Gazette Interactive, LexisNexis, iSurv, Mintel, IGD, Passport, ASABE or BSI Online. To search these you need to follow the Databases link in the list in the top right corner of the library home page.

Journal article and electronic information results




You can refine your results so that you only see ones which you can read immediately on screen by clicking on Full Text. Most full text links are on the right hand side of the screen, and the link says, for example, Full Text Finder or PDF.


If you have limited your results to full text and there is no link, click on the title of the item and the full text link is likely to be at the bottom of the next page.

Print books, print journals and e-books Refine your results by clicking on Library




To see what items you have borrowed and renew them you can log in from the top right hand corner of a results page or from the link at the top right of the Library home page
