

Butchers and Drovers Bursary Application 2016/17 Undergraduate Application

Are you about to complete your first or second year of a BSc, or FdSC Course and enrolled in fulltime education at Harper Adams University?

Does your course have direct relevance for a future career in the meat and livestock industry?

If you answer 'Yes' to either of the above, you can apply for the Butchers and Drovers (BDCI) Bursary!

It should be noted that preference will be given for those candidates who have family or employment links with the meat and livestock industry or who have an intention of seeking employment in the industry.

Application Process:

On A4 paper, **single sided** sheets, (**font Arial 11**), please explain why you would be interested in receiving the BDCI Bursary, including information about:

- 1. Why you have selected to study your chosen course?
- 2. What is the relevance of the course to the meat and livestock industry?
- 3. What family or other connections you have to the meat and livestock industry?
- 4. Why the receipt of this award would make a difference to you?
- 5. Discuss the future relevance your chosen direction of study will have to the meat and livestock industry

Separately, please also include **a brief CV**, **single sided** (font Arial 11) providing information such as name, address, and academic results to date.

Shortlisted applicants will be invited for interview at Harper Adams University on Wednesday 22 June 2016

The successful scholarship recipient(s) will receive a bursary of up to £5,000 for the each of the remaining academic years of full time study at HAU (excluding placement years). The award will be payable to the successful recipient(s) in two equal parts; half to be paid in February and the balance in May. Payment is conditional on the scholar remaining registered as a full time student at Harper Adams, and he/she must submit at least one written report to the Development Trust prior to the receipt of their second payment.

This is a competitive award and it will be evaluated on the merit of the applicant and his/her application, along with their academic achievements to date. The decision of the BDCI Bursary Committee is **final**.
