Recommended "to do" list

1. Listen to the two main talks.

These are applicable to all visitors, regardless of which courses they are interested in. The two talks are held at the start of the morning programme and repeated at the start of the afternoon programme. Venue and timings are shown on the table opposite.

2. Go to a course talk then visit the course hub

Our open day has been designed to allow you to explore a range of areas that interest you throughout the day or to focus on one course area in the morning and another in the afternoon, should you wish.

Each course area has a recommended programme, usually starting with a subject-specific talk, which lasts 30 to 45 minutes, followed by a series of activities and opportunities to chat to staff and students at a "course hub". (Note that Veterinary Nursing and Veterinary Physiotherapy talks start later, allowing time to explore the campus or visit the student services hub beforehand).

When you sign in, make sure you pick up open day information sheets for the courses you wish to explore.

5. Explore the grounds and facilities and learn about student life

– full details of tours on page 9.

3. Visit the student services hub

Admissions, careers, finance, accommodation, student services and learner support will all be based on the ground floor of the Faccenda Centre, which is also home to the Students' Union and is the gateway to the sports hall, dance studio, swimming pool and gym. More information on page 8.

4. Enjoy dining on campus!

While you are in or near Faccenda, drop into the Graze Café or QMH Dining Hall for refreshments or lunch. Full catering information on page 10.



Explore the campus

Walking tours

Tour of Elizabeth Creak Science Laboratories

Science plays a vital part in our research and teaching. Visit the new Elizabeth Creak building, a major extension to the Princess Margaret Laboratories (map ref 20 & 21). Staff will be happy to give you a tour of the facilities.

Tractor trailer tours

Hop aboard our tractor trailer for a chance to see some of the wider estate, including the university farm.

- Depart from outside Queen Mother Hall (QMH) from 10.00 onwards
- Trips last for 30 to 40 minutes and include full commentary
- Tours are busier after the larger course talks (such as Agriculture and Animals), so queuing times may be longer

Minibus tours

Dairy Unit

Take a guided tour of our 40-point internal rotary milking parlour and dairy unit, which serves 380 cows.

Veterinary Services Centre and Companion Animal House

Explore and meet the staff and students who work in these two fantastic resources for animal behaviour, veterinary nursing and veterinary physiotherapy.

The Veterinary Services Centre, with its hydrotherapy suite and consulting rooms, is used for teaching, research, and veterinary physiotherapy clinics.

The Companion Animal House includes a variety of animals such as chinchillas, degus, snakes, lizards, guinea pigs and rabbits.

Re-fuel with a delicious meal or snack provided by our award-winning catering team. Our outlets include:


QMH Dining Hall (Map ref 25)

Visual guide to key buildings

- 1 Weston Building – home to the largest lecture theatre, hosting the general talks and some course talks. You can't miss the shiny gold front!
- 2 The Food Academy – this is where we will be signing you in and also home to our food courses.
- 3 The Faccenda Centre – a one-stop shop for student services. Meet our various support teams here and make use of nearby catering outlets.
- 4 Queen Mother Hall – home to the refectory and ballroom. Tractor-trailer tours leave from outside here.
- 5 Elizabeth Creak Building – home to the new laboratories, easily identifiable thanks to the "living walls".
- 6 The Bamford Library – at the heart of your learning and of the campus. Student ambassador tours start from the grassy area.
- 7 Main Building – the original Harper Adams building, purpose built in 1901. No activities in here today, but impressive to see from outside the front doors.
