Who are they and what do they do?

We have a team of 14 student wardens, who are usually final year resident students, whose job it is to look after all student residents on campus. They are students of a similar age and with similar experiences to you.

Every night, during term time, two wardens are on duty between 5pm and 9am, to provide support to those on campus.



1st point of contact

Out of hours, if you find yourself in an urgent situation, which cannot wait until the next working day, you should contact the duty warden in the first instance.



1st aid if you are injured

All our wardens (and residences officers) are 1st aid trained and are able to help with all minor injuries. If you have called the emergencies services, please let the duty warden know so they can help direct them to the right place.



Locked out of your room

if you happen to forget your room key in your room and need letting back in out of working hours, please ring the duty warden - but don't abuse it... they need to get up for lectures too!



Comfort

If you or a friend are feeling upset, you can contact the duty warden to help comfort and provide support - no matter how small or big the issue may be.



Friendly ear

If you are feeling lonely or need to talk to someone, the duty warden is available. Remember, they are students too and have gone through similar stuff.



Feeling unwell

The duty warden is able to help you look after yourself or your friends if unwell or too much alcohol has been consumed... You need to know your limits though, they are not babysitters!



Refer on

Depending on the situation, the duty warden is able to make referrals to other departments, e.g. security issues or emergency faults in the accommodation out of working hours.
