Who can apply?

The Loxley Scholarship is open to all full-time **Year 2 and Year 4 BSc** students at Harper Adams University studying:

- Land and Property Management courses
- Agriculture with Farm Business Management

Background

This scholarship is offered by Loxley, a specialist law firm advising on all aspects of property law, with a particular emphasis on rural land and agricultural businesses. The firm was created in response to the diverse needs of owners and occupiers of land and those working in the rural sector.

Opportunities

If awarded, the successful recipient will receive an award of up to **£2,000**.

The award will be paid in two equal parts; half to be paid in March 2026 and the remaining balance in May 2026. Payment is conditional on the scholar remaining registered as a full-time student at Harper Adams University. They must pass all modules of study during the continuation of the scholarship and submit a letter of thanks for the sponsor to the Development Trust prior to the receipt of each payment.

This is a competitive award which will be evaluated on the merit of the submitted application and academic achievements to date. The Development Trust embraces diversity and promotes equality of opportunity and access to higher education. The Trust has been successful in supporting a wide range of students. It strongly encourages applications from students of all backgrounds. Where there are two applicants of equal merit, preference will be given to applicants who are from backgrounds that are underrepresented in UK higher education.

The decision of the Scholarship Panel is **FINAL** and they reserve the right to withdraw their award at any time should they feel this action is required.

Note that there will be no interviews for this scholarship, and a decision will be made by the sponsor based on the content of the application.

Application Process

Your application must include the following three documents, which should be saved in PDF format, named 1. Consent Form, 2. Response and 3. CV and emailed to DevelopmentTrust@harper-adams.ac.uk by 12 noon on Tuesday 27 January 2026. Email subject: **Loxley Scholarship**

1. **Consent Form** – this must be completed and signed to show that you have read and understood the Privacy & Data Protection Notice
2. **Response to question set by the sponsor** – in a document of no more than two A4 pages, give your response to the following question:

“Estoppel: a necessary safeguard against unfairness, or judicial interference with the family farm?”

3. **CV** – no more than 2 pages
