



The Butchers' and Drovers' Charitable Institution Undergraduate Bursary Application Information 2026/27

Who can apply?

The Bursary is open to all first and second year students (*in the 2025-26 academic year*) on a BSc or FdSc course and enrolled in full-time education at Harper Adams University, and BSc students currently on a placement year in their third year. **You must be able to demonstrate a relevance to the meat and livestock industry either within your chosen area of study or future career plans.**

It should be noted that preference will be given for those candidates who have family or employment links with the meat and livestock industry or who have an intention of seeking employment in the industry.

Opportunities

The successful scholarship recipient(s) will each receive a **payment of up to £5,000 for the awarding academic year and for each of the remaining academic years of full-time study at HAU (excluding placement years)**. For example, if you are successful and you are currently a second year BSc student, then you would receive funds in 2027/28, your final academic year, as 2026/27 is your placement year and is therefore not an academic year. The award will be paid in two equal parts; half to be paid in February and the remaining balance in May of the awarding year(s).

Payment is conditional on the scholar(s) remaining registered as a full-time student at Harper Adams University. They must pass all modules of study during the continuation of the scholarship and submit a letter of thanks for the sponsor to the Development Trust prior to the receipt of each payment.

This is a competitive award which will be evaluated on the merit of the submitted application, academic achievements to date and interview. The Development Trust embraces diversity and promotes equality of opportunity and access to higher education. The Trust has been successful in supporting a wide range of students. It strongly encourages applications from students of all backgrounds. Where there are two applicants of equal merit, preference will be given to applicants who are from backgrounds that are underrepresented in UK higher education.

The decision of the Scholarship Panel is **FINAL** and they reserve the right to withdraw their award at any time should they feel this action is required.

Application Process

1. **Consent Form** – this must be completed and signed to show that you have read and understood the Privacy & Data Protection Notice
2. **Covering letter** of no more than two pages, addressed to Mrs Doris Taylor explaining why you would be interested in receiving the BDCI Bursary and including the following information
 - Why you have selected to study your chosen course
 - The relevance of your course to the meat and livestock industry
 - What family or other connections you have to the meat and livestock industry
 - Why the receipt of this award would make a difference to you
 - The significance your chosen course of study will have to the future of the meat and livestock industry
3. **CV** – no more than 2 pages
4. **Finance Form** – you need to complete and return this document

Application Deadline: 12 Noon Tuesday 26 May 2026

Shortlisted applicants are required to attend a panel interview on **10 June 2026**. (Please note that an alternative interview date cannot be arranged).
