

The Lord Leverhulme's Charitable Trust Scholarship Application Information 2026/27

Who can apply?

The Lord Levehulme's Charitable Trust Scholarship is open to students studying full-time at Harper Adams University and the Harper and Keele Vet School **whose permanent home is in:**

- Cheshire
- Lancashire
- Merseyside or The Wirral
- Shropshire

and are studying the following **full-time** courses:

- Year 2 or Final Year BEng/BSc,
- Year 2 or Year 4 MEng
- Final Year FdSc
- Year 2 or Year 4 BVetMS at the Harper & Keele Veterinary School
- MSc

N.B. The address provided must be one that you have resided at for at least the last three years.
Important - Please Note: records will be verified with those previously given to the University.

Opportunities

If awarded, the successful recipient(s) will receive a one-off payment of **up to £1,500**.

The award will be paid in two parts; 75% to be paid in February 2027 and the remaining balance in May 2027. Payment is conditional on the scholar(s) remaining registered as a full-time student at Harper Adams University. They must pass all modules of study during the continuation of the scholarship and submit a letter of thanks for the sponsor to the Development Trust prior to the receipt of each payment.

This is a competitive award which will be evaluated on the merit of the submitted application, academic achievements to date and interview. The Development Trust embraces diversity and promotes equality of opportunity and access to higher education. The Trust has been successful in supporting a wide range of students. It strongly encourages applications from students of all backgrounds. Where there are two applicants of equal merit, preference will be given to applicants who are from backgrounds that are underrepresented in UK higher education.

The decision of the Scholarship Panel is **FINAL** and they reserve the right to withdraw their award at any time should they feel this action is required.

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Application Process

Your application must include the following three documents, which should be saved in PDF format, named

1. Consent Form, 2. Covering Letter and 3. CV and emailed to DevelopmentTrust@harper-adams.ac.uk by 12 noon on **Friday 13 November 2026**. Email subject: **Lord Leverhulme's Charitable Trust Scholarship**

1. **Consent Form** – this must be completed and signed to show that you have read and understood the Privacy & Data Protection Notice
2. **Covering letter** of no more than two pages, addressed to Mrs Doris Taylor and including the following information:
 - Why you have selected to study your chosen course;
 - Why the receipt of this award would make a difference to you;
 - Discuss the future relevance your chosen direction of study will have on/to the rural economy.
3. **CV** – no more than 2 pages

Application Deadline: 12 Noon Friday 13 November 2026

Shortlisted applicants are required to attend a panel interview on **Wednesday 2 December 2026**. (Please note that an alternative interview date cannot be arranged).
