

The Newport & District Agricultural Society Scholarship Application Information 2026/27

Who can apply?

The Newport & District Agricultural Society Scholarship is open to students studying at Harper Adams University **whose permanent home is in either:**

- Shropshire or
- Staffordshire

and are studying the following **full-time** courses:

- Year 2 and Year 4 BSc/BEng/MEng
- Final Year FdSc

The address provided must be one that you have permanently resided at for at least the last three years. Please note that records will be verified with those previously given to the University

Students who represent another Society **ARE NOT** eligible to apply for this scholarship. The NDAS reserves the right in association with the University, not to award a scholarship should there be no suitable candidate.

Please note: previous recipients of this scholarship are **not** eligible to apply.

Opportunities

If awarded, the successful recipient will receive a one-off payment of **£1,500**.

The award will be paid in two equal parts; 75% to be paid in February 2027 and the remaining balance in May 2027. Payment is conditional on the scholar(s) remaining registered as a full-time student at Harper Adams University. They must pass all modules of study during the continuation of the scholarship and submit a letter of thanks for the sponsor to the Development Trust prior to the receipt of each payment.

The successful scholar will be awarded membership of the Newport and District Agricultural Society for 12 months and will also be required to give a presentation at the Society's AGM in the academic year in which the scholarship was awarded (normally held in January).

The Society will invite the successful scholar to attend the Newport Show in the relevant academic year awarded and have some mutually agreed involvement in its planning and organisation. They would also be encouraged to develop a long-term relationship with the Society.

This is a competitive award which will be evaluated on the merit of the submitted application, academic achievements to date and interview. The Development Trust embraces diversity and promotes equality of

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opportunity and access to higher education. The Trust has been successful in supporting a wide range of students. It strongly encourages applications from students of all backgrounds. Where there are two applicants of equal merit, preference will be given to applicants who are from backgrounds that are underrepresented in UK higher education.

The decision of the Scholarship Panel is **FINAL** and they reserve the right to withdraw their award at any time should they feel this action is required.

Application Process

Your application must include the following three documents, which should be saved in PDF format, named 1. Consent Form, 2. Covering Letter and 3. CV and emailed to DevelopmentTrust@harper-adams.ac.uk by 12 noon on **Friday 20 November 2026**. Email subject: **NDAS Scholarship**

1. **Consent Form** – this must be completed and signed to show that you have read and understood the Privacy & Data Protection Notice
2. **Covering letter** of no more than two pages, addressed to Mrs Doris Taylor and including the following information
 - Please explain why you would be interested in receiving the Newport & District Agricultural Society Scholarship;
 - As a young person embarking on a career in Agriculture, what future role do you think Agriculture can play in tackling the threat of climate warming;
 - Please include the following information:
 - Why you have selected to study your chosen course;
 - Why receipt of this award would make a difference to your studies and future career aspirations.
3. **CV** – no more than 2 pages

In Summary

The scholarship will be awarded based on the following criteria:

- a) Agricultural content of the course being studied
- b) Past academic record
- c) Involvement in agricultural organisations
- d) Previous agricultural experience
- e) Future career aspirations

Application Deadline: 12 Noon Friday 20 November 2026

Shortlisted applicants are required to attend a panel interview on Tuesday 8 December 2026. (Please note that an alternative interview date cannot be arranged).
